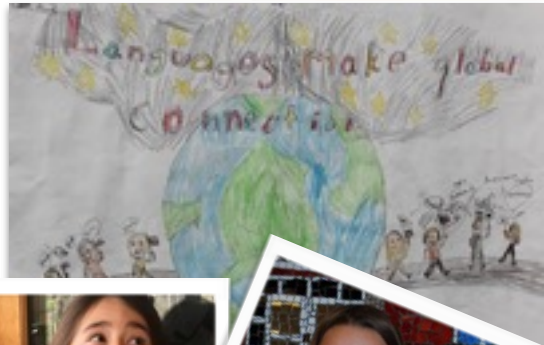

Rosie's Cause: The Crayon Initiative

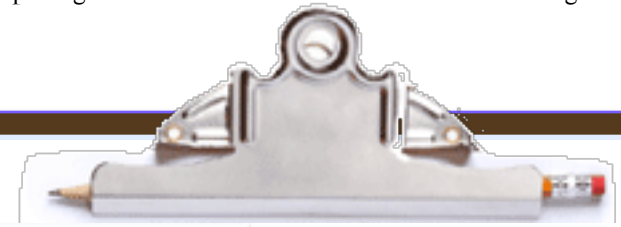
